Christian Formation

St. Matthias' Episcopal Church Christian formation program provides a safe and loving environment for our youngest parishioners to learn about God's grace, love and promises as revealed through His Word.

<u>Nursery</u> (infants to 5 years old) – Nursery hours are during both services, as well as during the Formation hour (during the school year). Experienced adults and youth provide loving and engaging care for infants and children to 5 years of age in Room 111 in the Education wing.

<u>Sunday School</u> (3 years through 12th grade) – Classes are held from 9:45-10:45 am during the school year.

Pre-K through 5th grades use a variety of current curricula. Focus is on Old and New Testament Bible stories, celebrations within the church calendar and relevant issues tied in with the teachings of Jesus – Earth Day, justice for all people, loving our neighbors, etc. We use a variety of learning media, including music, art, visual and move-

ment, which appeal to the learning styles of all ages and types of students. Sunday school classes meet in Rooms 101, 102 and 104 in the Education wing.

<u>Youth Ministry</u> (includes youth formation programs and youth group activities)

6th through 12th grades use the GROW curriculum. The lessons include a wide range of biblical stories while tackling spiritual habits at the same time. The kids love

the videos, graphics and games that go along with each series. The youth meet in the Youth Room in the Education wing. Just look for the room with the ping-pong table and table full of snacks in it!

St. Matthias' is blessed with dedicated Sunday school teachers who encourage our youngest parishioners to grow in their faith and trust in God. All our staff and volunteers who work with children and youth are fully trained in the *Safeguarding God's Children* program.

Many opportunities are available to participate in this vital ministry including Sunday school teachers, assistants or substitutes, special activities coordinators, and music leaders. Forming relationships with our youngest parishioners is a important part of supporting them on their spiritual journey and can make a huge, positive impact on their lives. EXTERNAL YOUTH MINISTRIES WE SUPPORT

Boy Scout Troop 1829 (Ages 11-17)

Meetings: Monday evenings at 7:15 p.m. at St. Matthias Episcopal Church

The Boy Scouts of America is one of the nation's largest and most prominent values-based youth development organizations. The Mission of the Boy Scouts of America is to prepare young people (boys 11-17) to make ethical choices over their lifetimes by instil-

ling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Law.



Troop 1829, established in 1982, is a member of the Huguenot Trail District of the Heart of Virginia Council. The Troop provides and encourages the development of leadership skills in young men through the use of Boy Scout skills. Adventure, learning, and fun for

both Scouts and their parents are essential elements of this highly successful program.

<u>Camp Chanco</u> - Chanco on the James is an adult and youth retreat center as well as a summer camp program located on 125 acres in Surry County along the James River. Chanco is an outdoor ministry supported by the Episcopal Diocese of Southern Virginia. The residential camp program offers climbing skill classes, waterfront and pool activities including swimming, canoeing, kayaking, and sailing instruction, as well as nature photography instruction, arts and crafts classes, archery classes, and zip line.

Meeting new friends, learning new things, living away from home in a safe, supportive environment is what makes camp a valuable experience. *Camp Chanco provides a safe place for youth of all ages...it's the place where kids have fun!*

Limited scholarships are available for summer camping.





ADULT CHRISTIAN FORMATION

Spiritual growth through education and Christian nurture is a life-long process for the purpose of maturing into the fullness of Christ (Ephesians 4)

The commission provides opportunities and encouragement for adults to grow spiritually within a Christian community, the ministries include:

The Village

This is a group of adults and parents who meet during the Children's Formation programs. It has self-directed discussions based on a variety of topics ranging from Christian faith to parenting. It meets on Sunday mornings from 9:45-10:45 am during the school year in Room 109 in the Education wing. Coffee and snacks provided.

The Seekers

This group meets on Sunday mornings between services in the library. It takes place from 9:45-10:45 am. During the regular school year and between 9:15- 9:45 am during the summer. A variety of spiritual disciplines, literature and scripture are topics for the group discussions. The study material is available at each gathering, so no prior reading is necessary.

Lenten and Advent programs

These programs help to enrich the parish community. Pamphlets and other supplemental materials are available to enhance these important observances both individually and for an entire family.

The Monday Bible Study

This study group meets virtually between 11:00 am -.12:00pm. This is an academic approach to the study of scripture. It is for members who want to delve deeper into scripture and its meaning on a collegiate level.

The Men's group

This group meets virtually on Tuesdays at 8:30 am. They examine a wide range of Christian literature which provides thought-provoking reflections and lively discussions. Most importantly this gathering provides mutual support, community, and camaraderie.

The Co-Ed Book Group

This group meets once a month on Tuesdays at 4:00 pm. A highlight is the guest speakers and authors who give talks on books and topics of interest. This group explores both religious and non-religious literature and meets a wide range of interests.

Monday Kerygma

This group meets in the afternoon between 2:00 -4:00 pm. Kerygma is part of an adult learning community. There is an assigned reading which is reviewed and discussed during each session. Every Kerygma class is unique. Mutual support and a sense of community are an essential part of every group.

Wednesday Morning Kerygma

This group meets at 10:00 -11:30 am. Every group has their own literature and individual focus. These selections of Christian literature provide for enriching discussions on faith and spirituality. Each group helps to support every member in their faith journey, while providing a sense Christian community.

Altar Guild

The Altar Guild prepares all things necessary for the conduct of worship and provides

a prayerful and rewarding ministry to a group of meticulous volunteers.

- A team of two prepares the Altar each Sunday and any services during the week.
- Each team is responsible from Monday to Monday for cleaning and polishing the silver communion pieces, laundering the linens, refilling the candles and picking up the fresh altar flowers.
- An Altar Guild Manual is located in the Sacristy as a guide on how to "dress the altar" for the liturgical seasons and special services.



Flower Guild

The Flower Guild is an opportunity to learn the art of creating centerpieces while preparing the altar flowers for our Sunday services and other occasions. We are fortunate to have an experienced Master Gardener and a Nationally Accredited Flower Show Judge. The flower guild would welcome your participation.

Lay Eucharistic Ministers/Lay Readers/Youth Readers

- licensed through the Diocese of Southern Virginia
- assists the clergy in reading lessons from Holy Scripture,
- leads the Prayers of the People, and
- administers the consecrated bread and wine.

Lay Eucharistic Visitors

A selected number of parishioners are licensed as Lay Eucharistic Visitors (LEV) and distribute Holy Communion from the Reserved Sacrament to those hospitalized or homebound. They visit hospitals, nursing homes, private homes and extended care facilities. The ministers are charged with carrying love, hope and prayers for the community to our absent family members.

Ushers

A dedicated group of ushers extend the love of Christ by welcoming parishioners and assisting in distributing bulletins, collecting the offering, and straightening the pews.

PASTORAL MINISTRIES

Healing Ministry

The healing ministry is a vital part of our worship service and is extended to those confined to home or hospital as an expression of the care and concern of the St. Matthias

church family, developing a stronger sense of community through the efforts of everyone who contributes time, talent and treasure to pastoral care. During the Eucharist, Healing Ministers are present for those who desire special prayers of healing. The Healing Ministers will be at a prayer desk in the front of the nave, to the left of the Altar.

Stephen Ministry

Stephen Ministers — lay caregivers - provide one-to-one Christian care to those facing a crisis or life challenge. Stephen Ministers provide distinctively Christian care to people in one-to-one confidential relationships and use their care giving skills to touch the lives of others. The name comes from St. Stephen, who was the first Deacon commissioned by the Apostles to provide caring ministry. (Acts 6). People Who Need Care receive quality, Christ-centered, confidential care for their needs in times of personal difficulty. Lay People grow spiritually as they see God working through them to bring healing to a hurting person.

Comfort Ministries:

The Pastoral Care Commission assists in meeting the spiritual care needs of parish members and their families. This can range anywhere from home visitation to formal counseling provided by the pastor. Pastoral care is listening, supporting, encouraging and befriending. It can encompass a wide variety of issues including health, social and emotional support at time of need or celebration and is a loving way of caring for people. Volunteers provide meals, books, plants or cards, as well as home or hospital visits and rides to medical appointments.

<u>Pastoral Visitation Teams:</u> At St. Matthias, we have dedicated and trained Pastoral Visitation teams who serve as the hands and feet of Christ, visiting and maintaining connection with those parishioners who ,for a variety of reasons, are unable to attend St. Matthias—whether it be for a short or longer period of time.

<u>Eucharistic Visiting Teams</u>: We have teams of Eucharistic Visitors who bring Communion and a brief prayer service with music to three local Assisted Living Centers monthly.

COMMUNICATIONS

Effective communication is essential for the health and wellbeing of parish life. MUSIC

The music ministry adds immensely to each Sunday service as well as Special Occasions during the liturgical year. The music ministry uses vocal and instrumental music to enhance the spoken part of the worship service. The Music Ministry also prepares special services such as 'Festival of Lessons and Carols' during Advent, Ash Wednesday, Holy Thursday, and 'Tenebrae' for Good Friday.



Chancel Choir

Chancel Choir sings for the 11:00 am worship service and for special services such as Festival of Lessons & Carols, Christmas Eve, Ash Wednesday, Holy Thursday, and Good Friday. The Chancel Choir is open to those in 7th and older and rehearses at 6:30 pm on Thursday evenings.



• Holy Apostolic Band

The Holy Apostolic Band leads the music for the 8:30 AM worship service and for special services such as Christmas Eve, Ash Wednesday and Holy Thursday. This band is open to those in Middle School, High School, College and older who sing and/or play instruments. We rehearse at 7:00 pm on Tuesday evenings.
